

World Autism Day - Sparkling Day of Inclusion





Finance Information

Attention parents and carers,

2025 Materials and Service charges have now been invoiced to all students. Please note the following information;

- All students have been issued a \$300 original invoice
- All students will receive the \$200 government subsidy, therefore the balance will be \$100 per student
- All families will be issued with a statement showing that the subsidy has been applied

Please note: Students approved for School Card assistance are not eligible to receive this rebate, as they are already exempt from paying Materials and Service fees.



Medication

MEDICATION



If your child/ren needs to have medication at school it must be brought to Student Services and discussed with our staff. It is a Department for Education requirement that a Medication Agreement form is provided and must be completed by a GP or specialist. Staff are not able to administer medication unless this form is provided to us.

Medication must be provided with clearly labelled instructions, including the expiry date.

Asthma Care Plans must be provided for a child to receive Ventolin. Ventolin must be labelled with a label from the chemist and you must also provide a spacer labelled with your child's name.
