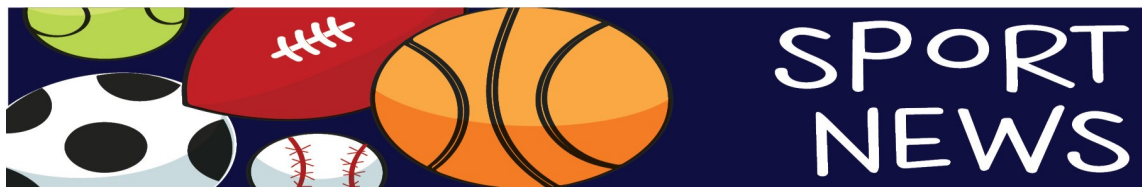

Our teams kicked off season 2018 with a Lightning Carnival on Saturday May 12 where they played 3 consecutive games against different schools in a shortened format.

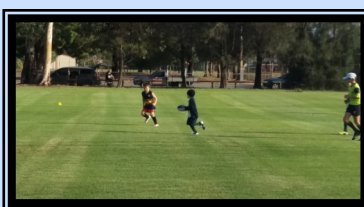
All of our teams had fun and learned what school football is all about: Having fun and trying our best!

Year 4 Red Ball Tennis Tournament

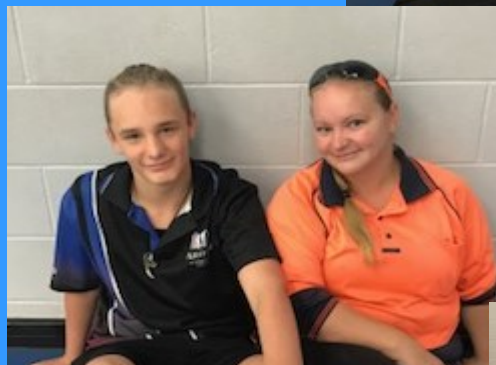

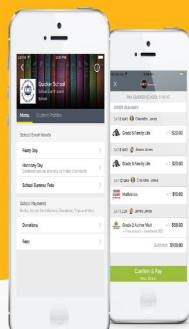
