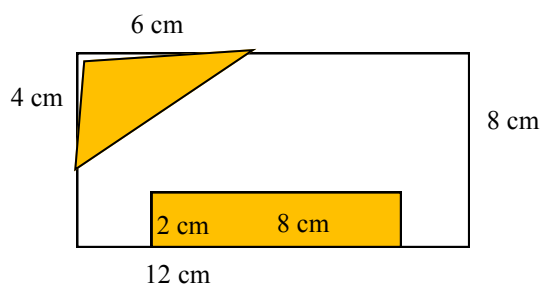
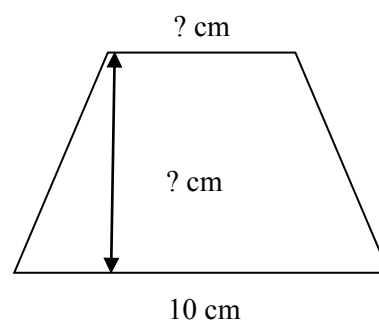


## Can you solve this problem?

### Mathematicians - extension maths questions



Qu: 1 Find the area of the white coloured region.  
To solve this problem students needed to apply their understanding of how to calculate area of rectangles and triangles.



Qu: 2 What would the unknown measurements be of the trapezium if the total area was equal to 54 cm squared?  
To solve this students need to work backwards from the answer to find the unknown measurements.  
They also need to know how to calculate the area of a trapezium

## The students in year 6 and 7 can!

This is an example of the mathematical questions which are solved during a maths extension lesson led by Mrs Browne. At ENPS we believe every student should be challenged with their learning and now offer a chance for students who have demonstrated a sound understanding of numeracy to extend their learning. Mrs Browne (year 6/7 students) and Mrs Przibilla (year 4/5 students) are working to develop problem solving skills and using mental maths in everyday situations. Students work with their group twice weekly and are demonstrating a fantastic ability to retain and transfer knowledge in numeracy. This term Mrs Browne has challenged students to find the area within shapes using partial measurements. (see question above) Mrs Przibilla has challenged the students with being able to double fractions in order to follow recipes.



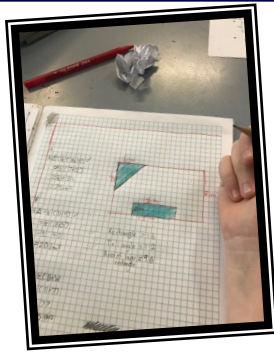

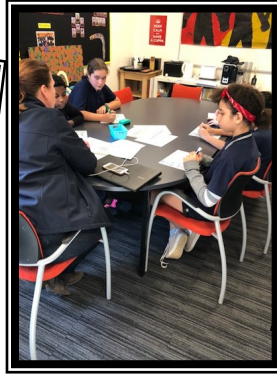
### 60th Birthday Stickers

## Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

All schools are required to collect information about the numbers of students that they provide adjustments to under the Disability Discrimination Act (1992) and Disability Standards of Education (2005). From 2018, this data will be used as the basis for national funding. The NCCD involves the collection of;

- the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- the level of adjustment provided to students
- student's type of disability if known

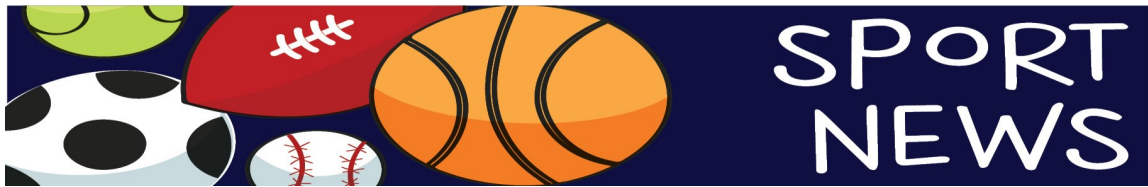
Under the model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions. If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information will be included in this year's data collection.
